## Subject: Appreciation for Your Support and Important Attendance Matters

As we are halfway through the first Spring Term, I am pleased to share some positive news regarding our school's attendance records. Your unwavering support has contributed significantly to an improvement in whole school attendance when compared to the Autumn Term.

To date, the total attendance for the school is $90.9 \%$ which is below the national average of $91.3 \%$. Much of this is due to genuine illness but families are also taking unauthorised holidays during the term and some students are absent too often without a genuine reason. If a child is not in school, they cannot learn and the impact of this can be significant on their future life chances and opportunities.

From the table below, you can see the significant impact that being absent from school has on your child's education over a school year:

| Attendance | Days Missed | Lessons Missed | School Weeks Missed |

| $100 \%$ | 0 days missed | 0 lessons | 0 weeks |
| $95 \%$ | 9.5 days missed | 57 lessons | 1 week \& 4.5 days |

| $85 \%$ | 28.5 days missed | 171 lessons | 5 weeks \& 3.5 days |
| $80 \%$ | 38 days missed | 228 lessons | 7 weeks \& 3 days (over half <br> a term) |

Please can I ask for your support in ensuring that your child attends school every day and arrives on time in school for 8:30 am on their year zone ready for an 8:40 am start.

We understand that there will be absences that are unavoidable, but attending school is a legal requirement and students should endeavour to attend every day. If a child presents as unwell in school, a decision will be made on whether to send them home, or for them to remain in school. If your child is not well enough to attend school, please ensure you inform school of their absence and the reason for them being off school.
