# MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

### Within the top 5!

I would like to take the opportunity to thank our students and staff for the part they play in building and sustaining a strong and improving reputation for our School. You may recall that, back in October 2021, I shared with parents and carers how thrilled we were with the overwhelming numbers of families placing an interest at our open evening events for a place for their child at The Hart School.

Many of you will recognise that 01 March 2022 was the day for secondary school place allocation, not just across Staffordshire but across England, where families for current Year 6 pupils will have been awaiting the outcome for their onward school choice come September. Indeed, many of our current families have been in that exact position!

We have received our pupil notifications for transition to Year 7 in September 2022 – and as in previous years, our School has continued to grow as a popular choice with families in our town. I am heartened and humbled by this, mostly because it speaks to a confidence and trust held in our educational offer.

#### **Oversubscribed**

We are delighted to share that once again we are oversubscribed for September 2022. At The Hart School, our current pupil admission number is 220. This year we have seen a record number of applications being made – 341 applications in total!

Our first choice preference applications made this year was 278 which is up by 59 more applications when compared to 2021 for first choice.

You may have also noted from local press coverage that The Hart School is within the top 5 as 'the most popular secondary schools in Staffordshire!' published by Staffordshire-live.co.uk.

We are also the second most popular school for 'first choice preference' within a ten-mile radius making us once again oversubscribed with waiting lists across year groups. We have agreed to increase our offer to 250 places this year to accommodate a further 30 students to support our local community with school places.

I am sure you are just as proud as we are of our growing successes over the past few years. I can certainly say that The Hart School is a school of choice for families within and outside of Rugeley along with a popular and very successful sixth form!

Staffordshire County Council manage our applications process and also our appeals. Any appeal made, would have to be made to Staffordshire County Council. The school does not have any influence on admissions into The Hart School.

#### **YEAR 11**

Year 11 students have now finished their final round of pre-public examinations, with just six school weeks to go before their final exams commence in May. The next six weeks are critical if students are to build on the progress that they have made so far and achieve the best grades possible in their exams in the summer. It's imperative that students are in school every single day and arrive at their lessons on time and prepared to learn. We will also be offering Easter and May half term revision sessions. We ask that all students attend the revision and intervention sessions that they are invited to as they are tailored individually to what the students need.

It's the final countdown, Year 11! Make every lesson, every day, count.

#### GOTTA SING

On Wednesday 2nd March, 16 students represented the Hart school brilliantly in Stafford's 'Gotta Sing' event at the Gatehouse Theatre. We had many soloists performing brilliantly and students were in excellent voice and did the school proud. They performed an A Cappella version of 'Vuelie', that song from Frozen that no-one remembers the name too. Alongside a joyous rendition of 'the Oliver medley.' The school and CET got a fantastic mention, and the compare was very impressed with the core values of CET, putting creativity at our heart! The evening was a great success!'

# LIFE AND SOUL DAY

#### Friday 18 March was an exciting day of learning for our students.

At The Hart School we provide all pupils with the chance to learn beyond the curriculum, something which we are extremely proud of. As well as offering a strong curriculum, we are continuing to develop our Life and Soul Days. These are excellent opportunities for all students to extend their learning beyond the curriculum and work with peers in a group environment. During the Life and Soul days students develop highly important transferable skills for the future.

On our latest Life and Soul Day, our Year 7 students explored the religions and cultures of the world with the Open Centre delivering workshops. Bringing this to life was the head coach of a bhangra group who delivered a workshop discussing India and its rich farming culture as well as teaching the students aspects of Bhangra dancing.

Our Year 8 students worked remotely looking at health relationships and respect.





Year 9 students had the opportunity to hear from employers from different sectors as well as having the opportunity to gain a taster in some KS4 option subjects in readiness for choosing their GCSE options.

With Year 10 we launched work experience, which is calendared for the week Monday 11 July 2022. Students had the opportunity to familiarise themselves with the online portal as well as understanding the importance of the WEX week. Students also watched the production 'Calling It Out' from Loudmouth which is a brand-new theatre in education programme on harmful sexual behaviours and sexual assault for young people aged 13 upwards. This was followed with small workshops throughout the day. Students also had PSHE themed talks on knife crime and county lines with Activating Creative Talent.

Year 11 students had a series of PSHE themed talks on knife





crime, CSE and gangs and county lines with Activating Creative Talent. They also had a session on Sexual Health delivered by an NHS nurse with an opportunity to sign up for a C-Card which enables access to free condoms discreetly and confidentially from some local pharmacies.

Our Sixth Form students experienced a range of sessions including the session on sexual health. They also had workshops on road traffic safety, student finance and learnt more about the UCAS process.

This day saw the creativity, ambition and potential of our students coming to life through our extended curriculum.








### **OUR YEAR 8 RISING STARS**

- Arrive to lessons on time, dressed correctly, with all of their basic equipment

- They ask questions when they don't understand and answer questions with their best effort
- Learning new things is hard, outstanding learners work through the learning struggle and ask for help
- Outstanding learners will go home and look over what they have learned in the day, particularly those things that were difficult.

#### **BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK**

Last week was British Science Week and to celebrate staff from The Hart School paid a very special visit to John Bamford Primary School to show student's a heart dissection and to show them what they have to look forward to in year 10!

Our "Growth" poster competition was also launched this week to all students in all year groups. Posters will be judged on creativity, level of scientific accuracy and how it has incorporated the theme of Growth. We have had some excellent entries so far. The deadline for all entries is Friday 25th March. Hand yours into the Science team to be in with a chance of winning a prize!

Elsewhere, Year 8 scholars have been making huge progress towards their Eco School's project. They have completed the environmental review of the school and have decided on our school's 3 target areas for improvement. The three areas of focus are:

- · Increasing biodiversity
- · Reducing litter
- Conserving energy

Moving forwards there will be two opportunities for pupils across all years to get involved. The first one will commence next half term and pupils can enter a design of an insect and bee hotel. The top designs will be constructed using recycled and donated materials to increase the biodiversity around the school site. The second opportunity will involve selecting an area of the school to develop a wilding area and support the planting and maintenance of this area.

Within the summer term pupils in year 9 will be working towards completing a project to create sustainable packaging for food. They will be conducting investigations within Science to identify materials capacity to keep food hot/cold and fresh. This will support them in designing a brand and prototype of the food packaging in Art and Design and with the use of Maths they will need to consider the cost and dimensions of the packaging and the consideration of the sustainable nature of their products source.


# WHOLE SCHOOL PRODUCTION OLIVER! 5-8 JULY 2022, 7PM
