MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Open Evenings

We were delighted with the interest registered at our Open Evening events in October. So much so, we offered a third night, with all events across the three days being fully attended. Due to a demand for visits to the school in October, we adapted these evenings to allow prospective parents and children to visit the school site with lots of safety measures in place, along with school tours taking place during the day. There was a lovely atmosphere across the school and a good opportunity for families to see the school in action and to speak with staff and students. I was also delighted to see so many familiar faces during the evenings following my visits to the primary schools.

Oversubscribed

As anticipated, we have been blown away by the number of students who have made an application for September 2022. We have just had an indication of our first preferences for September 2022 and it is clear that we will be significantly oversubscribed once again. We are very excited about the journey The Hart School is on and it is clear that the school

is certainly becoming a school of choice for parents and children. We look forward to welcoming new families to our school community.

Last day arrangements

The last day of term is Friday 17 December. Lessons will run as normal for Periods 1 to 2 and students will be able to get hot food during break 1. Period 3 will be spent in tutor and assembly to celebrate our students' successes across the Autumn term. School will finish at 12.30pm on this day.

The bus route operated by Select Buses is not able to collect students at 12.30pm on this day. If you are unable to make alternative arrangements for your child to return home early, they will be supervised in school and the bus will take them home as normal.

Covid-19

Thank you as always for your support of the students this term and for your support for the continuing Covid-19 management measures we are working to.

I would like to thank all students and members of The Hart School community for their response to the changes following new DfE guidance regarding mask wearing in schools. Although, we adopted wearing face coverings from September, we have seen an increase of the school community wearing them more consistently whilst moving around the school. Please continue to check that your child has a face covering with them before leaving for school.

Lateral Flow Testing

We must remain vigilant in our response to Covid-19. It is essential that students are:

- 1. Using their LFT kits twice weekly, Sunday and Wednesday evenings
- 2. Maintaining good hygiene through regular use of hand sanitiser on entry to lessons

3. Ensuring that they follow public health advice on self-isolation and do not attend school if they have symptoms or a positive LFT

We will, as always, keep all measures under constant review and will be in touch if there are any further required amendments to our practices.

Travel on School Buses

In order to ensure the safety of all passengers and the driver, all students are expected to wear face-coverings when they are on school transport and worn throughout the journey to and from school (unless they are exempt).

LIFE AND SOUL DAY

On Thursday 2 December all students were given the chance to learn beyond the curriculum.

Our Life and Soul days are excellent opportunities for all students to extend their learning beyond the curriculum and work with peers in a group environment. During these days students develop highly important transferable skills for the future.

Our Year 7 students explored British Values through a group-based Desert Island project. Students gained understanding of how communities and society operate, as well as democracy in choosing their own leader of the island. They created their own set of values and beliefs as well as learning about laws and the criminal system.

Year 8 explored the religions and cultures of the world. Bringing this to life was the head coach of a Bhangra group who came in and delivered a workshop discussing India and its rich farming culture as well as teaching the students aspects of Bhangra. During the morning both Years 7 and 8 were also involved in an assembly on Hate crime delivered by CACH -Communities Against Crimes of Hate.

Year 9 students worked on a STEAM project and in teams were constructing and racing a formula one car using a gaspowered launch system.

Our Year 10s participated in The Inspirational Learning Groups Esports Digital Challenge. Students worked in teams, looking at all aspects of creating, designing and launching a new computer games concept. They identified a target market before developing an idea for a brand new, downloadable computer game. Students considered all aspects of their game design, including characterisation, game play, cyber-security and add-ons before considering how they would promote their new game to their target audience. This challenge helped students to develop their entrepreneurial and digital skills as well as promoting key skills such as creativity, teamwork and communication. The winning team will also go forward to represent the school in the national final at the ICC in Birmingham in July 2022.

Year 11 worked within the RSHE guidance by exploring relationships as well as completing a scenario-based journey through the risks, pressures and consequences of being involved in unhealthy relationships. Students also had sessions to understand their post 16 options from Sixth Form, to college to apprenticeships and T levels, with some students gaining an experience of Sixth Form.

Our Sixth Form students experienced student life as the visit de Montfort University. This encompassed a campus tour as well as an accommodation tour. Students had the opportunity to talk to student reps as they fully immersed themselves into University life for the day.









COMMUNITY CLEAN

In November, memorial events took place all over the country to honour armed forces members who have died in the line of duty. In preparation for these events two students went the extra mile.

Elise Cowdell & Joshua Blocksidge, who are part of Brereton Youth Volunteers, spent their time cleaning the memorial in Brereton on Saturday 13th in preparation for the Brereton Service.

Amazing work from both. They are a real credit to The Hart School.
