## Supporting our local community - Rugeley Food Bank


We certainly appreciated the warmth of our Christmas jumpers last week, all in aid of an excellent local cause.

# SIXTH FORM APPLICATIONS AT ALL TIME HIGH



## ELSA SUPPORT

**Our support for students wellbeing is continuing to grow...**

We now have three ELSA staff who work with students on self-esteem, confidence, anxiety, understanding emotions and relationships with friends. ELSA stands for Emotional Literacy Support Assistant. We also work with and fund Malachi Counselling Service who work with students, using counselling based on therapeutic techniques.

Christmas can be difficult for students and families, there is a change in routine and also family members who are no

longer with us can be sorely missed.

The NHS have a really useful website which is aimed at young people and is also useful for parents to look at too. They have information on self care, sleep, how to deal with unhelpful thoughts, self-care and social media. The information is presented by short videos which are from 50 seconds to 3 minutes. They also have links to other websites including Young Minds and The Mix (The Mix has really

useful information on being safe online too).
