## **History** Year 11 Curriculum Overview

Intent: By the end of the year 11 students will have completed a Depth Study and a Period Study. Through the Depth Study they will develop understanding of the complexity of a society or historical situation including the social, economic, political, religious and military aspects of the time period. They will demonstrate knowledge of the key features of the society and will demonstrate understanding of second order concepts - change, continuity, consequence, similarity, difference and significance. Through the Period Study, they will understand the unfolding narrative of substantial developments and issues associated within a time period. They will demonstrate understanding of consequence and significance. Through the Period Study, they multiply and the unfolding narrative of substantial developments and issues associated within a time period. They will demonstrate understanding of consequence and significance. They will be able to offer an analytical narrative – analysing events to find connections that explain the way in which events unfolded.
