Year 10 Curriculum Overview

Intent: By the end of year 10 the pupils will have a developed and broad knowledge of the main religious tradition in the UK, Christianity. They will have considered difficult questions and beliefs around relationships and families. The pupils will have developed their extended writing skills and their ability to explain, understand and evaluate beliefs for Christians and other belief system.

<p>Core Course Topic: These topics are taught through the identified terms. They are taught in small bitesize chunks and revisited regularly.</p>	<p>Christianity – Beliefs and teaching Students should be aware that Christianity is one of the diverse religious traditions and beliefs in Great Britain today and that the main religious tradition in Great Britain is Christianity. Students will study the beliefs, teachings and practices of Christianity specified below and their basis in Christian sources of wisdom and authority. Students will study the influence of the beliefs, teachings and practices studied on individuals, communities and societies. Students will explore a range of different Christian perspectives in their answers including Catholic, Orthodox and Protestant. Students will build on the beliefs and teachings of Christians by discovering how these are put into action. Also drawing comparisons between different denominations within Christianity.</p>	<p>Religion: Peace and Conflict Students study religious teachings, and religious, philosophical and ethical arguments relating to the issues that follow, and their impact and influence in the modern world. They should be aware of contrasting perspectives in contemporary British society on all of these issues.
