

## **Evaluation of the Pupil Premium Strategy – September 2017-18**

At The Hart School, all staff and governors are committed to improving outcomes for disadvantaged learners. The impact and spending strategy for pupil premium funding is reviewed at every Academy Council meeting. The annual review is published on the academy's website in September each year.

The progress of students entitled to pupil premium funding matches their peers and, on average, they attained one grade less than other students in 2017/18.
